# **What to Expect With Acne Scars Surgery**

If you have tried home treatment methods and are not getting the results that you are looking for, [acne scars surgery](#) may be the best option for you. While many simpler methods can reduce the appearance of acne scars, you may find that the reduced appearance still does not satisfy your goals.

Perhaps you want to eliminate their appearance completely, or maybe you have more severe acne scars that do not respond as much to home treatments or skin peels. In that case, look into some of the following options.

### **Types of acne scar surgeries**

One method of acne scar surgery is laser treatment, which uses lasers of differing intensity levels to sort of “reshape” the scar tissue and greatly reduce the redness found around problem areas. Different types of lasers can be used, depending on your skin condition and what your goals are for improvement.

The amount of treatments needed can vary, with many people finding that one laser surgery for [acne scarring treatment](#) provides a satisfactory amount of permanent results. One of the main side effects from laser treatment is the appearance of a certain amount of redness, which can last for a few months afterwards before disappearing.

Punch excisions and skin grafting are used for more serious and severe acne scars. Some of these deeper scars are often known as “ice pick” or “boxcar” scars, and require punch excisions because other treatments simply don’t do enough to reduce or remove their appearance.

The punch excisions remove the scars individually, and the skin is either sutured together afterwards or grafted from another area of the body to allow for subsequent healing to take place. In the case of skin grafts, the skin may appear uneven in tone at first, but treatment makes this effect go away in about a month.

Collagen injections can be used as a surgery for acne scars method to treat smaller, softer, more superficial scars. Collagen, which is a natural body substance, will be injected in a way so as to “fill” needed areas, or “stretch” others. The results are not permanent, however: they usually last several months.

These [acne scars surgery](#) options are just the tip of the iceberg, as there are others to look into as well, such as treating acne scars with dermabrasion. It’s important to consult with your dermatologist to really get an idea of which type of surgery is really right for your skin type, the acne scars you have, and your budget.
